 - Earthquakes motivate independent travel and long cane training
- Loves working with children

In British Columbia

- Worked with veterans
- Worked with first nations
 - Culturally sensitive practice
 - Tribes, clans
 - Dress down: corporate wear can be intimidating
 - Use accessible language: stick not cane
- Look out for bears!

Working in snow

- Rug up with layers of clothes and waterproofs
- Choose boots with tyre tread
- Choose hunter's mittens can free trigger finger to feel vibrations through long cane
- Step, don't slide feet
- Learn to fall safely roll sideways
- Choose cane/tip to contrast with snow
- Listen, to walk parallel with traffic
- Sounds change in the snow muffled and shushing
- Landmarks disappear in the snow
